

By incorporating devotionals into practice, a coach can help quizzers develop **a** love for God's Word that lasts far beyond their quiz years!

Bible Quiz Coach Can Use Devotions Effectively

1. Every practice should include a devotion time

- Begin or end each practice with a short devotional time.
- Follow-up on what was learned from previous devotion.

2. Read the Bible Verse Together

- Have a quizzer read the key verse aloud.
- Discuss its meaning and how it connects to the assigned material for the week.
- Ask quizzers to explain the verse in their own words to ensure understanding.

3. Engage with the Devotional Story

- Read the short story provided in the devotional.
- Encourage discussion by asking, "How does this relate to our own lives?"
- Relate the story to real-life challenges quizzers may face, such as handling competition, teamwork, or trusting God.

4. Make the Faith Connection

- Reinforce how Scripture is more than just words to memorize—it's God's message to us.
- Discuss how the verse applies to everyday situations, such as making wise choices, being honest, or trusting God during challenges.
- Show how each verse points back to Jesus and His plan of salvation.

5. Discuss It

• End devotional time with a prayer, either using the one provided or asking a quizzer to lead.

• Encourage your child to put what they've learned into action

Bible Verse

The Greatest Commandments

Bible Verse

"You must love the Lord your God with all your heart, all your soul, all your mind, and all your strength. The second is equally important: 'Love your neighbor as yourself.' No other commandment is greater than these." – Mark 12:30-31 (NLT)

The two greatest commandments remind us that salvation transforms our hearts, enabling us to love God and others in ways that bring glory to Him.

Discuss It

Why do you think loving God comes first? How does loving God help us love others better?

Prayer Dear God, thank You for loving me first and teaching me how to love You and others. Help me to love You with all my heart, soul, mind, and strength, and to show Your love to those around me. Teach me to live in a way that honors You and reflects Your goodness. Amen.

Live It Memorize Mark 12:30-31 and think of one way you can show love to God and one way you can love your neighbor today. Spend time in prayer, thanking God for His love, and ask Him to help you live out these commandments in your daily life. Share an act of love with someone to reflect God's heart.

Made in God's Image

Bible Verse

"So God created human beings in his own image. In the image of God he created them; male and female he created them." – Genesis 1:27 (NLT)

Story

Logan and his sister, Ava, were drawing pictures of their family. Logan laughed when he saw Ava's drawing. "That doesn't look like Dad!" he teased. Ava crossed her arms. "I tried my best! It's my picture of him."

That night, during family devotions, their mom read Genesis 1:27. "God made people in His image, which means we are made to be like Him in special ways." Logan tilted his head. "But we don't look exactly like God, right?"

Mom nodded. "That's right! Being made in God's image doesn't mean we look like Him. It means we can think, make choices, and love Him—things no other creature can do."

Then Dad added, "But Adam and Eve made a bad choice. *When they sinned, they realized they were naked, and God made them clothes from animal skins.*" Ava frowned. "So, God still took care of them, even though they disobeyed?" "Yes!" Dad said. "Even when we sin, God still loves us and provides for us." Logan smiled. Faith Connection

That night, during family devotions, Ethan's mom read Romans 3:23. "Everyone has sinned and falls short of God's standard," she explained.

Ethan thought for a moment. "So, sin is like the mud puddle? No matter how hard we try, we can't get past it on our own?"

Mom nodded. "Yes! When Adam and Eve chose to sin, it affected everyone.

Now, all people are born with sin in their hearts, and we naturally do wrong things. That's called 'original sin."
