

- **Prayer Habit** It teaches children to rely on God in all circumstances. By making family devotions a daily priority, parents can instill lifelong faith habits in their children and create a home centered on God's Word.

Parents Using Family Devotional Effectively

Here's a simple guide for parents on how to incorporate devotionals into everyday life:

1. Set a Consistent Time

- Choose a time that works best for your family's schedule—morning, mealtime, or bedtime.
- Consistency helps make devotionals a habit, creating a special routine for your family.
- Start with follow-up what was learned before and how it was applied.

5. Discuss It

• Use Discussion question to deepen what we learn.

6. Pray Together

• Use the provided prayer or let each family member pray in their own words.

7. Application to our lives

• Encourage your child to put what they've learned into action

Preparing for Christ's Return

Bible Verse

"So you, too, must keep watch! For you do not know the day or hour of my return." – Matthew 25:13 (NLT)

Story

Mia's family was **going on a trip**, and her mom told her, "Be ready to leave early in the morning." Mia packed her suitcase, laid out her clothes, and set her alarm. But her brother, Noah, didn't get ready. The next morning, when it was time to go, Mia was **ready**, but Noah was **scrambling to pack** and nearly missed the trip!

That night, during family devotions, Mia's dad read Matthew 25:1-13, the Parable of the Five Wise and Five Foolish Bridesmaids.

"In this parable, five bridesmaids were prepared with enough oil for their lamps, but the other five weren't ready when the groom arrived. Only those who were prepared got to enter the wedding celebration."

Mia tilted her head. "So, this story is about being ready for Jesus' return?"

"Yes!" Mom said. "Jesus told this parable of the Bridesmaids to remind us that some people claim to be Christians but won't be prepared when He returns."

Dad continued, "The Bible also talks about the Revelation of Christ, when Jesus will return after the Great Tribulation to rule and reign for a thousand years. That's why we must always be ready, because we don't know when He will come."

Mia grinned. "So, just like I was **ready for our trip**, I need to **be ready for Jesus' return**?"

"Exactly," Dad said. "We prepare our hearts by following Jesus, obeying His Word, and staying faithful."

Faith Connection

The Revelation of Christ refers to His return after the Great Tribulation to rule for 1,000 years. Jesus told the Parable of the Five Wise and Five Foolish Bridesmaids to remind us that not everyone who claims to be a Christian will be prepared for His return. That's why we must live ready for Jesus every day!

Discuss It

Why do you think some people **won't be ready for Jesus' return**? How can we **live prepared** for His coming?

Prayer

Dear Jesus, thank You for **Your promise to return**. Help me to **live for You every day** so I will always be **ready and faithful** when You come again. Amen.

Apply It This week, think about **one way you can stay prepared** for Jesus' return. Maybe by **reading your Bible, praying, or sharing Jesus with someone**. **Are you living ready?**

A World Unprepared

Bible Verse

"When the Son of Man returns, it will be like it was in Noah's day." – Luke 17:26 **Story**

These devotions are built around Bible Fact-Pak 20-point questions. To use them effectively, keep a copy of the Fact-Pak Study Guide nearby for reference. If you don't have one on hand, the summary below provides an overview of the questions to help you understand the origin of these devotions.

Ordinances of the Church (Matthew 28:19)

- 442: Isaiah prophesied that Jesus would take our sicknesses and remove our diseases.
- 443: The purpose of Jesus' miracles was to demonstrate God's approval of Him.

Second Coming of Christ

Bible Verse

"Look, I am coming soon, bringing my reward with me to repay all people according to their deeds." – Revelation 22:12 (NLT)

Story

Noah's grandparents were coming to visit, but they didn't say **exactly when** they would arrive. Every day, Noah checked the window, making sure the house was clean and ready. "I don't know when they're coming, but I want to be **ready when they do!**" he said.

During family devotions, Noah's dad read about the **Second Coming of Christ**.

"The **New Testament talks about Jesus' return over 300 times**," Dad explained. "That means it's **really important!**"

Noah tilted his head. "So, **Jesus promised He would come back**, but we don't know **exactly when**?"

"Yes!" Mom said. "That's why we should **always be ready** by living for Him every day."

Dad continued, "The **Second Coming of Christ** includes two major events:

- 1. **The Rapture**, when Jesus takes believers to be with Him.

Dear Jesus, thank You for **Your promise to return**. Help me to **live for You every day** and to be **ready when You come again**. Amen.

Apply It This week, think about **one way you can stay ready for Jesus**—by praying, reading the Bible, or sharing His love with someone. **Are you excited for His return?**

Resurrection and New Life

Bible Verse

..."When you put a seed into the ground, it doesn't grow into a plant unless it dies first... A different plant grows from each kind of seed." – 1 Corinthians 15:36, 38 (NIV)

Story

Mia and her dad planted **tiny seeds** in their garden. At first, there was **nothing but dirt**, but after a few weeks, **green sprouts appeared**! Mia was amazed. "It looked like nothing was happening, but the seeds were **growing into something new!**"

That night, during family devotions, Mia's dad read 1 Corinthians 15, known as the "resurrection chapter."

"In this chapter, Paul explains that our resurrection is like a seed—what is buried doesn't stay the same, but God transforms it into something new."

Mia tilted her head. "So, when we die, it's not the end?"

"Exactly!" Mom said. "Just like a seed dies in the ground before becoming a plant, our earthly bodies will die, but God will raise us with new, bodies."

Dad continued, "That's why we don't have to fear death—because Jesus was resurrected, we will be too!"

Faith Connection

Discuss It

Why do you think Paul **used seeds as an example** to explain the resurrection? How does knowing that **we will be raised to new life** give us hope?

Prayer Dear Jesus, thank You for the promise of resurrection. Help me to trust in Your power to bring new life and to look forward to the joy of being with You forever. Amen.

Apply It This week, plant a **seed in a cup or garden** and watch it grow. Every time you see it, **remember God's promise** that one day, we will have **new life** with Him in Heaven!

Ordinances of the Church

Bible Verse

"Go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit." – Matthew 28:19 (NLT)

Story

Noah's soccer team had a **special ceremony** where each player received a jersey with their name on it. "Now everyone knows I'm part of the team!" Noah said proudly.

That night, during family devotions, Noah's dad read about water baptism and Communion, which are the two ordinances of the Church.

"Just like putting on your jersey shows that you're part of the team, water baptism shows that you belong to Jesus," Dad explained.

Noah tilted his head. "So, everyone who believes in Jesus should be baptized in water?"

Bible Verse

"And they will go away into eternal punishment, but the righteous will go into eternal life." – Matthew 25:46 (NLT)

Story

Bible Verse

..."I know that my Redeemer lives, and that in the end he will stand on the earth. And after my body has decayed, yet in my body I will see God." – Job 19:25-26

Story

Mia's goldfish, Sunny, had been part of the family for years, but one morning, she found him floating at the top of the tank. Sad and confused, she asked her dad, "What happens when we die?"

That night, during family devotions, Mia's dad read Job 19:25-26, where Job expressed faith that he would be resurrected and see God, even after his body decayed.

Mia tilted her head. "So, even after Job's **body was gone**, he believed he would **see God again?**"

"Yes!" Mom said. "And that's exactly what happens to Christians when they die. The Bible says that at death, a Christian's soul and spirit go immediately to be with the Lord."

Bible Verse

"But you belong to God, my dear children. You have already won a victory over those people because the Spirit who lives in you is greater than the spirit who lives in the world." -1 John 4:4 (NLT)

Story

Noah's school had a **tug-of-war contest**. At first, his team struggled against the other side, but then a **strong teacher joined Noah's team**, and suddenly, they won easily! "It made all the difference to have someone **stronger on our side**," Noah said.
