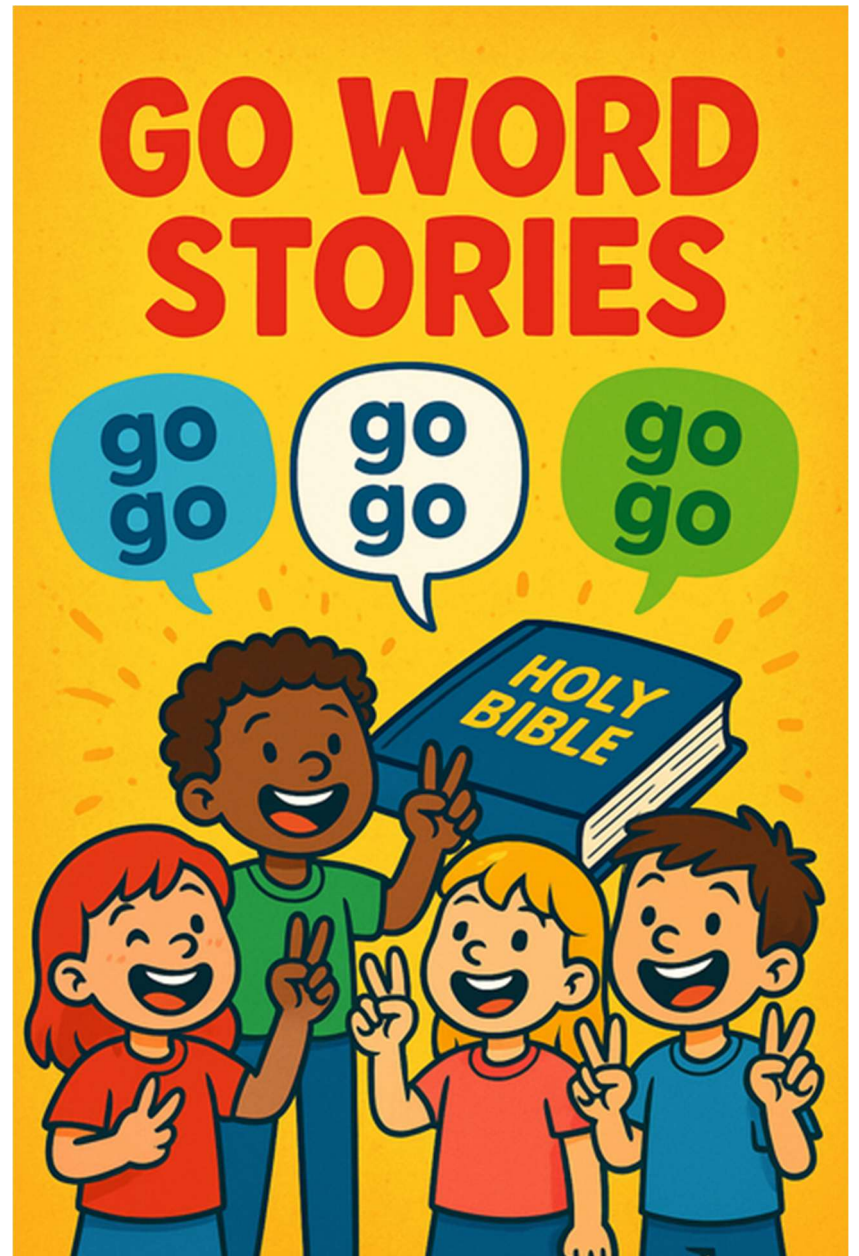

Not all disciples are apostles, but all apostles are disciples. A disciple is defined as a follower of Jesus and **an apostle is a special messenger sent by God**. There were 12 apostles but many disciples of Jesus. When Jesus left earth, he commanded his 12 apostles to make disciples of all nations.

The teachings from the Bible are called doctrine and it is the guide we use to make disciples. The doctrine of faith is our shield and **faith is belief and complete trust in God**.

Sin entered the world through the disobedience of Adam and Eve and ever since we have been under sin's curse. John 3:4 tells us sin is breaking **God's** law and is contrary to the law of **God**. James 4:17 tells us, knowing to do good and not doing it is sin. In combining the two **sin is defined as refusing to do God's will as revealed by His Word and His Spirit. Death is the separation of the body and the soul**, and death is the penalty of sin.

God has a plan of salvation and gives it to us with grace. **Grace means that God offers us His love and forgiveness as a gift and not because we earned it or deserve it.** We are saved from sin by the gracious gift of **God** in sending his son Jesus to die for our sins. **We call the price Jesus paid for our salvation redemption.**

In order to be saved we must accept **God's** gracious gift of redemption, with faith and with repentance. **Repentance means having a change of mind, heart, and direction.** With our acceptance of **God's** gift, and repentance of our heart. **God accepts us as though we had not sinned which is justification.** After **God's** acceptance **comes sanctification which is being separated from sin and set apart to serve God.** **God** works through all this with us by the power of the Holy Spirit.

After we are saved, prayer, praise and worship to **God** become a big part of our life. **Prayer is talking to God** and 1 Thessalonians 5:17 tells us to "Never stop praying." Praise and worship are very close to the same thing and the wording very similar, so it is important to learn it like a quotation question. **Worship is exalting and adoring God for who he is. Praise is expressing our love for God for all He is and all He has done.** Worship is from the heart and Praise is action. Worship is exalting God for who He is, and Praise is for all He is and has done. When Jesus was born the **angels, which are spiritual being created by God** sang praises to **God** above the shepherds. The wise men when they found Jesus bowed and gave gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh in worship to **God's** son.

One thing you can count on is that **God is immutable, which means he does not change, He is always the same.** That can be reassuring to know **God** is with us to the end and all we learn from Bible doctrine is immutable, **God** and the doctrine of the Bible does not change it.

On Paul's 3rd missionary journey, he went to the city of Ephesus. The people of Ephesus believed in witchcraft and after [they had turned to God, they burned all their books of witchcraft](#). The book of Ephesians was a letter he wrote to the people of Ephesus and in Ephesians chapter 6 Paul encourages children to obey their parent, then later in the chapter Paul tells us to [put on the whole armor of God so that we can resist the attacks of the devil](#). Ephesians teaches us that the [devil](#) is a sneaky liar he loves to trick us into doing things that hurt people and hurt God. With God's Armor we can defeat the devil.

[In our Christian armor truth is our belt](#), and it holds the rest of our armor in place so we must be sure that it's on good and tight. In our battle truth is important because the [devil](#) is a master of telling lies. He whispered lies to Adam and Eve in the garden disguised as a snake and he whispers lies in our ears today. But the truth of God's Word will protect us from the [devil's](#) lies and hold us true.

The battle is dangerous and can fill our hearts with fear. For this reason, [God has given us body armor which is his righteousness](#). The Bible's definition can be defined in three ways:

- 1> The Bible is the God's inspired Word.
- 2> The Bible is the God's revelation to all people of himself.
- 3> The Bible is the God's plan of salvation for all people.

By inspired Word we mean God gave the writers each Word of the Bible, not just the thoughts and ideas. God's revelation means God shows us who he is. In the Old Testament God's plan of salvation was to give an animal blood sacrifice for our sins. In the New Testament God's plan of salvation was to give his son Jesus as blood sacrifice for our sin.

The Bible is not just one book but is composed of sixty-six books and the Bible is divided into two divisions the Old and New Testament; testament means covenant, contract, or agreement. The Old Testament contains 39 books. The New Testament contains 27 books. The Bible was written by about forty different people over a period of 1600 years.

Bible (8)

The Bible was not written in English the language we speak today. The Old Testament was written in Hebrew and the New Testament was written in Greek; both were translated to English later. Therefore, we have many different versions of the Bible in English. They all are the true Word of God just translated differently to help people to understand the meaning of the original text.

The first book of the Bible which tells us about the beginning of the world, is Genesis. Genesis is part of the Pentateuch which is another name for the first five books of the Bible written by Moses. The Old Testament of thirty-nine books are divided into four sections, Law (5 books), History (12 books), Poetry (5 books), and Prophets (17 books). In the five books of Poetry is the book of Psalms which is the longest book in the Bible with 150 chapters and is a collection of hymns and songs.

The New Testament begins with the four gospels: Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John. Gospel means "Good News" and the theme of the four gospels is the life and teachings of Jesus. After the four gospels we have the book of Acts which tells us about the beginnings of the Early Church. After Acts we come to the thirteen books written by Paul who wrote more books in the Bible than any other person. The last book of the Bible is Revelation, and it is composed almost entirely of prophecies of the future.

The Bible is God's inspired Word.

The Bible is God's revelation to all people of Himself.

The Bible is God's plan of salvation.

Early in the new church the apostles were preaching in the Jewish temple and converting so many to Jesus that the High Priests became jealous and had them arrested, beaten and shamed. This did not stop them but only made them more determined to work for Jesus because they were counted it worthy to suffer disgrace for the name of Jesus.

The Apostle Peter was a great leader in the early church, he raised Tabitha from the dead in answer to prayer. There was the Roman officer Cornelius who sent for Peter to come and preach to him. While Peter was preaching at Cornelius's house the Holy Spirit fell upon all who were listening to the message, they were all saved, filled with the Holy Spirit, and baptized in water. Once King Herod arrested Peter and was going to kill him for preaching. Other Christians began to pray, and an angel opened the prison for Peter and freed him.

Eventually the persecution of the new church went beyond beatings, and many were killed or martyred for being a Christian. History tells all but one of the Apostles were martyred for preaching the Good News and that was John who wrote a gospel, three epistles and the book of Revelation. The first person to be martyred for being a Christian was Stephen and early convert of the new church.

Church (4)

Saul of Tarsus was there when Stephen was killed, and he worked hard to arrest many Christians. While Saul was on the road to Damascus to arrest Christians, Jesus appeared to him in a light from heaven, and Saul accepted Him as Lord. God changed Saul's name to Paul when he was converted. Paul became a leader in the new Church and went on to write 13 books of the Bible, more than any other person. Paul went on three missionary journeys; the first Barnabas went with him. When they were preaching in Antioch people first called Jesus' followers Christians. In Lystra many people thought Paul was a God because of miracles God performed through him. The people of Lystra stoned him and left him for dead, but God healed him. On Paul's 2nd missionary journey his chief helpers were Silas and Timothy. Paul and Silas were put in prison and God freed them with an earthquake, afterward Paul told the Philippian jailer how to be saved, Acts 16:31 says, "Believe in the Lord Jesus and you will be saved, along with everyone in your household". It was while on this journey God showed Paul a vision of a man from Macedonia calling for help. Luke accompanied Paul on some his journeys. Luke was very smart and was a doctor by occupation, Luke also wrote the book of Acts and one of the Gospels. Paul was a tentmaker and in Corinth he became friends with fellow tentmakers Aquilla and Priscilla who assisted him in preaching.

Psalms is the longest book in the Bible with 150 chapters. King David wrote many of the Psalms, and they are a great source for encouragement from God. Psalm 117 is the shortest chapter with 2 verses, and both give praise to God. Psalm 119 just two chapters away is the longest chapter with 176 verses and is about the Word of God and its great value. King David wrote most of the longest book, but Paul the apostle wrote more books than any other person. Those books are called epistles because they were letters sent by an apostle. The epistles of Paul were shared by the early church believers.

Genesis the first book in the Bible tells us about the beginnings of the world. It tells us where the universe came from: Genesis 1:1 In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth. Adam and Eve were the first man and woman. God created them in his own image, and we are different than animals. God created us in his image both inside and out. We have a spiritual nature which permits us to reason, make choices and to know and love God. Adam and Eve were created in a sinless world but because they were created like God, they had a choice of what they could do. God gave them a garden, in which there were two trees God said not to eat from: the tree of the knowledge of good and evil and the tree of life. They disobeyed God by eating from the tree of knowledge of good and evil. They were sent out of the garden and sin entered the world through their disobedience.

Adam and Eve later had two sons named Cain and Abel, the first two brothers. When they were grown Cain became jealous of Abel and in jealousy murdered him. Cain was the first murderer.

When **Jesus** was brought before Pilate, Pilate could not find any fault with **Jesus**. In the hopes of saving **Jesus**, he offered the people a choice between releasing Barabbas a convicted thief and robber and **Jesus**. The people chose to ask Pilate to release Barabbas instead of **Jesus**.

Jesus was sentence to death by being crucified and nailed to a cross on a hill called "Golgotha" which means The Place of the Skull. Pilate had a marker placed on **Jesus'** cross which read "**Jesus** of Nazareth, the King of the Jews". As **Jesus** hung on the cross the sun became dark for three hours and there was an earthquake. The Bible tells us the Roman officer who oversaw **Jesus'** execution said, "This man truly was the Son of God!" and then **Jesus** died.

After **Jesus** had died, Joseph of Arimathea and Nicodemus wrapped his body and buried him in a tomb. There were people who worried **Jesus'** body would be stolen and had Pilate put guards outside his tomb. On the third day angels came and rolled away the stone in front of **Jesus'** tomb and the guards ran away afraid. Mary Magdalene and a friend came that morning and **Mary Magdalene** was the first person to see **Jesus** after He was resurrected. She ran quickly back to town to tell the other disciples. All but Thomas saw **Jesus** shortly after in a closed room and when the others told **Thomas** he at first doubted **Jesus'** was resurrected. Thomas believed when he saw him. More than 500 people saw **Jesus** after he was raised from the dead. **Jesus'** Apostles walked and talked with him for about 40 days after his resurrection and then he was taken up into a cloud until they could no longer see him.

Jesus Apostles then went to Jerusalem to pray and wait for the Holy Spirit. While waiting they chose to replace Judas as an Apostle and chose **Matthias** a man who had traveled with them since **Jesus** was baptized by John the Baptist.

On the day of Pentecost there were 120 people waiting together in an upstairs room for the coming of the Holy Spirit. The Old Testament prophet Joel had foretold the outpouring of the Holy Spirit and it was on the day of Pentecost the gift of God was given to the Church, the Gift of the Holy Spirit.

Peter began to preach a sermon afterward to the people near the building. There were about 3000 people saved because of Peter's sermon on the Day of Pentecost.

One day Peter and a friend were going to church and there was a lame man at the temple gate and God healed him after Peter said to him: Acts 3:6 "I don't have any silver or gold for you. But I'll give you what I have. In the name of **Jesus** Christ, the Nazarene, get up and walk!"

The church grew and with honesty and love the people gave and shared everything with one another. A husband-and-wife **Ananias and Saphira** joined the church and lied to the Holy Spirit about what they had to share and were punished for their sin.

Jesus taught his disciples many things, there was once while teaching his disciples he asked them who they thought he was. Peter replied in [Matthew 16:16](#) saying "*You are the Messiah, the Son of the living God.*" The [three disciples Peter, James, and John](#) were **Jesus'** closest friends, and this is best shown in that they were the three chosen to go up on the high mountain where he was transformed and spoke to Moses and Elijah.

A disciple is a learner of **Jesus**. **Jesus** taught with parables telling familiar stories and later explaining to his disciples the spiritual truths. There is the parable of the wise and foolish man who built a house. [The foolish man built on sand which was an example of those who hear His teachings but do not obey them.](#) The wise man built on the rock which showed those who hear His teachings and follow them. **Jesus** also told the parable of the Good Samaritan who helped the man who was beaten and robbed and then explaining to his disciples this is the example we should follow. Another parable is The Sower who planted seeds and depending on where the seed fell determines how the plant grows. [The seed Jesus later explained was the Word of God.](#) Then there is the rich man who had more than he needed and when he died, he could not take it with him. [The point being, don't be greedy your life is not measured by how much you own.](#) The parable of the Prodigal Son, prodigal means wasteful. The son left his father taking his inheritance and spending it all to the point he could not take care of himself, the son repented, and the father took him back in with forgiveness. **Jesus** was telling us in the Prodigal Son story, God is willing to forgive and restore the sinner who repents. **Jesus** was asked should we pay taxes, and his answer was "Give Caesar what belongs to Caesar and give God what belongs to God."

Jesus (8)

Jesus not only taught but did many miracles. [There was the man born blind and Jesus put mud on his eyes and told him to go and wash it off and the man could see.](#) **Jesus** was teaching to a group of five thousand men, plus women and children. **Jesus** took a boy's lunch of five loaves and two fishes and fed everyone. Zacchaeus was a tax collector and became so curious to see **Jesus** he climbed a tree to see him. The miracle is that Zacchaeus repented and became an honest tax collector, returning to the people he had cheated four times over and he gave half of everything he had to the poor because of **Jesus**.

In **Jesus** last days before his crucifixion, [he came into Jerusalem riding on the colt of a donkey in a Triumphal Entry fulfilling an Old Testament prophecy.](#) He had a last supper with his disciples and humbly washed each of the disciple's feet. This was [the night before his crucifixion and Jesus went to the garden of Gethsemane to pray.](#) After he prayed, Roman guards came to arrest him. Judas Iscariot one of his apostles betrayed him with a kiss and showing the guards which man was **Jesus**. **Jesus** was taken before several rulers before they finally sentenced him to death on the cross. Peter followed as close as he could because he was anxious about the outcome. Three times he was confronted about being one of **Jesus'** disciples and three times he denied it. On the last denial a rooster crowed. Peter ran away because he [remembered Jesus had prophesied that Peter would deny knowing Jesus three times.](#)

After defeating Satan's temptations with the word of God Jesus began selecting his disciples. Andrew was first and when he went to tell his brother Simon Peter he announced, "We have found the Messiah". there Jesus' appearance was transformed, and he talked with Moses and Elijah. Proving again he was the Son of God.

spared the Israelites if they covered their door threshold with the blood of a lamb for protection. Ever since that time **God** established a feast to remember the Israelites deliverance from Egypt and called it **Passover**, because the angel of death passed over the Israelites home which was protected by the blood of the lamb.

After the tenth plague of the death of the firstborn Pharaoh let the people go and Moses took all the people and his family out of Egypt, including Miriam who was Moses' sister. They got to the Red Sea and Pharaoh changed his mind. They had nowhere to go, it was either be killed by Pharaoh or drown in the Red Sea and **God** provided a miracle by parting the Red Sea. The Israelites crossed on dry land and when Egyptians tried to follow the parted sea closed and they were all drowned.

God (7)

God kept the Israelites from thirst and starvation. At a place called Marah there was water but it was bitter. The people needed water and **God** had Moses throw a piece of wood into the bitter water and make it fresh again. When the people were hungry **God** sent mana from heaven, a bread like substance which appeared in the morning on the ground. At Rephidim there was no water at all, so **God** gave them water and it came from rock after Moses struck it with his staff

Honor your father and mother, that your days may be long upon the earth.

They did not worship the **Gods** of Babylon but still prayed to the true **God** of Israel. The king built a tall golden statue of himself and commanded all to bow down and worship it. Three men stood out for refusing to bow down and worship the gold statue. **Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego were thrown into a blazing furnace because they refused to worship the gold statue set up by the king.**

The Jewish people were in captivity for 70 years and during that time Babylon was conquered by Persia with a new king. King Darius took over and decreed that no one could pray to any **God** but only pray to him. **Daniel continued to pray to God just as he always did, even though the king decreed he could no longer pray to his God.** King Darius liked Daniel but because he made a law that people would only worship him. **The king threw Daniel into the lions' den because he continued to pray to God. God** protected Daniel and shut the lions' mouths and they did not eat Daniel or cause him any harm.

Daniel lived to be an old man and the city of Babylon was conquered again by King Belshazzar. King Belshazzar had many parties to celebrate himself and during one party an invisible hand began to write on a wall of fresh plaster in words the king did not understand. God gave the Israelites 10 commandments to live by and they are first recorded in Exodus chapter 20. The first four were how to serve God by making him number one in your life. The remaining 6 commandments were how to respect other people. Jesus gave us two commandments to live by, the first to put God first and love him with all your heart, all your soul, all your mind and all your strength. The second command was to love your neighbor as yourself.

Commandment five is honor your father and mother. Commandment six is "You must not murder" which defines the sacredness of human life. Commandment seven is "You must not commit adultery" which protects the sacredness of marriage. Commandment eight is "You must not steal" which protects our right to own possessions. Commandment nine is "You must not testify falsely against your neighbor" which prohibits lying by always telling the truth. Commandment ten is "You must not covet anything that belongs to your neighbor" which forbids wrong desires and jealousy.

When God gave Moses the ten commandments, he was up on Mount Sinai for a long time. So long that the people thought Moses had died and they had Aaron make an idol of a golden calf that they could worship as God. The sin of making and worshipping the idol of the golden calf caused God to punish many of them.

God then called Moses to build the Tabernacle in which the people could worship God. From the tribe of Levi God chose the priests to offer sacrifices to God for the people. The main purpose of the sacrifices and offerings was to purify the Israelites of their sins.

They suffered many hardships and even doubted Moses and Aaron were God's chosen leaders. God caused Aaron's staff to sprout leaves and bud as proof that Moses and Aaron were God's chosen leaders. Once they camped in a place where there were many poisonous snakes, and the people were dying from the snake bites. Rehoboam the son of Solomon became king after Solomon, but Rehoboam did not treat the people well and ten of the twelve tribes of Israel rebelled and formed their own kingdom. After Solomon's death the Israelites divided into the Kingdoms of Israel and Judah. The southern kingdom of Judah was ruled by Rehoboam and in the northern kingdom of Israel the people chose Jeroboam to be their king. Jeroboam established idol worship in the northern kingdom of Israel so the people wouldn't go to Jerusalem to offer sacrifices. He feared that if the people went to Jerusalem, they might follow Rehoboam because Jerusalem was in his kingdom of Judah.

A few kings later there arose a prophet of God named Elijah when the evil king and queen of Israel were Ahab and Jezebel. King Ahab worshiped the false god of Baal, and he made a challenge to Elijah to see which god was greater the God of Israel or Baal. They built an altar with a sacrifice on it and took turns praying to their god to consume the sacrifice. The Baal prophets went first and prayed all day long and nothing happened. Then Elijah prayed and God came down and consumed the sacrifice and the rock altar with fire, God did this so that all of Israel would know that God was really God.

GO-WORD For many years the people of Israel were ruled by judges and the history of these leaders are found in the seventh book of the Bible and it is called Judges. One of the last judges and a priest was **Samuel**. At an early age **God called Samuel** and one of the first judgements he made was against another priest named Eli.

The people still worshiped God in a tabernacle which could easily be moved. The tabernacle was where they kept the ark of the covenant. **According to the book of Hebrews the ark of the covenant was a sacred box which contained the stone tablets of the Ten Commandments, the gold jar of mana, and Aaron's staff that had sprouted leaves.**

After many years of judges, **the Israelites wanted a king instead of a judge, because they wanted to be like other nations.** **Samuel** anointed the first king of Israel, and his name was Saul. Saul started out well as King, but pride got in his way and **Saul rejected God's command and did things his way and God rejected Saul.** **Samuel (3)**

As a young boy **God chose David to be the next king of Israel** and Samuel anointed him as well. **David** did not become king right away but grew up doing many great things. **David** killed a bear and a lion with a sling as a boy and that alone sounds great but later **David took the sling and killed the giant called Goliath.** He grew up serving God in the army of Saul and **David was best friends with Saul's son Jonathon.** **David was put in charge of his army and his commander was Joab.** Together with Joab they won many battles, so many that Saul became jealous and wanted to kill **David.** There was a time Saul was chasing **David** and **David had an opportunity to kill Saul but refused because God had chosen Saul to be king.**

After Saul died God chose **David** to become king. **David** ruled as king for forty years. He was a warrior king and spent much of the time at war defending his throne even from **David's own son Absalom who tried to take the kingdom from him.** **David** was a good king and **when it was discovered that Jonathan had a son, he showed Mephibosheth kindness by taking care of him.** **David** is credited for writing much of the book of Psalms, **David wrote Psalm 139, and it tells us life begins before birth in the mother's womb.** **David** sought God in everything he did, and God told **David to choose Solomon David's son to be king after his death.** **David (18)**

Solomon began his reign as king seeking God and **God gifted Solomon with wisdom when he became king.** God blessed **Solomon** with many things, **Solomon took the tabernacle tent and built a permanent building and called it The Temple of the Lord.** **Solomon** became rich and famous so much so that the queen of Sheba came to visit him. **Solomon (5) Total (26)**
